-Dress Rehearsal of CDMP Roles and Responsibilities on Tuesday

Membership Law

- -Met with Membership personnel yesterday for update and status of Kahnawà:ke Membership Law (KML).
- -Membership reported they met with the Council of Elders (COE) and are reconstituting them to make minor amendments for 55 applicants that have been pending membership decisions.
- -Amend KML by removing the COE as being the responsible body to make amendments to the law. Once COE removed from KML; amendments begin through the CDMP, approximately June earliest and September the latest.

Matrimonial Real Property

-No criteria or procedure for emergency/urgent law making under CDMP or MCK Legal.

KLCC MEETING

ROC - February 16, 2012 - FINAL

-Kahente requested direction from KLCC as she is meeting with the MRP working group next week.

Suggestions:

- -Hold Community Consultation to present issue explaining there is a timeframe to complete. Request not to amend but to adopt what's there; could have executive order.
- -Present the law that Six Nations created and adapt to Kahnawà:ke's needs.
- -To piggy pack with Election Law requesting mandate to accept law but that law be prescribed to make revisions within same year. Skip 3 Hearings because it has to be finalized soon.
- -Conduct door-to-door survey as Six Nations did.
- -Develop Communication strategy and develop questions to ask community

Factors:

- -Eligible voters under Election Law and on Kanien'keha Registry. Don't necessarily have to live in Kahnawà:ke.
- -How do we reach those that don't live in Kahnawà:ke? We could go online; publicize in papers and other media sources.
- -Need minimum of 25% of voting population which translates to as little as 12.5% voting yes. Approximately 1500 people are eligible to vote, of that we need 25% YES votes or 780 people to vote yes.
- -Need to strategize how we're going to get 25% vote and know if Council is going to follow 25% of eligible voters.
- -Determine how strict the 25% criterion is.
- -Need to engage community, which may take longer.

Conclusions:

It was suggested to keep development of process for Urgent Laws on KLCC agenda until decision reached. May consider or need to conduct a risk analysis. Could use same method that SSSL used to consult community.
